Consider and discuss quote from Goddard Enterprises for the siren system

It also has the ability to automatically set the alarms off if the Weather Service puts us under a tornado warning. Alderman Ashley Carr made a motion to purchase the siren system and Alderman Chris Cody made the second with all in favor.

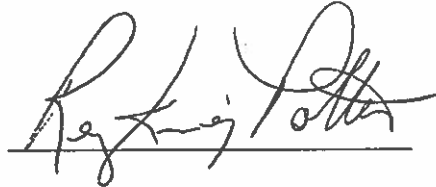
Consider Minutes from Previous Meeting: Alderman Jason White motioned to approve the minutes as written, Alderman Ashley Carr made the second, with all in favor.
